The social walking group (all are invited) followed a slightly different path, on Tuesday the 8th of August (was that a pun?). Instead of following a walk from one of the "Intriguing





THE OTAGO PHOENIX CLUB Annual General Meeting Monday 4th December 2023 Nomination Form

In accordance with sections 7.0 and 8.0 of our constitution, at the AGM, we will elect the Officers and Committee Members for 2024:

7.0 Officers

- 7.1 The Officers of the Club are the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer.
- 7.2 The Officers of the Club are elected at the Annual Meeting.
- 7.3 To be eligible for election as an Officer of the Club, a member must be financial, be nominated and seconded by financial members of the Club, and have indicated their willingness to be nominated.
- 7.4 All Officers of the Club are eligible for re-election.

8.0 Committee

- 8.1 The Committee comprises the Officers of the Club, a representative of the supervisors of the exercise sessions, and between four and ten other members as elected at each Annual General Meeting from among the financial members of the Club.
- 8.2 The Committee has power to co-opt up to two additional members onto the Committee.
- 8.3 All Committee members, including Officers, retire at the Annual General Meeting. Retiring members of the Committee, including former Officers of the Club, are eligible for reelection.

Covid 19 and Cardiovascular Disease (CVD)



Covid-19 is an independent risk factor for heart disease and may cause significant injury and chronic heart complications.

Acute and chronic cardiovascular complications include heart attack, myo-pericarditis (inflammation of the heart muscle),

Takotsubo (temporary stunning of the heart muscle) or even heart failure (weakened heart muscle leading to fluid buildup in the lungs).

SARS-CoV-2 can result in cardiovascular events both during acute infection and as a late complication. Excess cardiovascular deaths during the 2020 pandemic were thought to be due to decreased access to care but it is now apparent that Covid-19 was the contributing factor. This burden of CVD will likely be felt in every nation's health system and economy for many years. The evidence suggests that non-specific symptoms such as fatigue, breathlessness or palpitations should be investigated.

Influenza is also associated with adverse cardiovascular outcomes, which can be prevented with vaccination. This can be done by ensuring all those who meet age- or risk-based indications are vaccinated annually against influenza. Preventing Covid-19 is an important strategy for patients with heart risk factors. Prevention requires vaccination, including periodic boosters, mask wearing, and safe indoor air. Rapid treatment with anti-virals may be needed also.

All of the above was taken from the recent European Society of Cardiology paper titled "The impact of Covid-19 and Covid vaccination on cardiovascular outcomes," Zubair A et al. There has been a noticeable increase in the number of patients coming through our department this year. You will have seen on the news how busy primary health, hospitals, and emergency departments are.

Please keep up to date with all of your vaccinations. Not just for your own benefit and your family's benefit, but also to help those of us working in health.

I've always been interested in the Second World War. Born just a few years after, I

remember Anzac Day as being very solemn and quiet. I remember conversations among the adults in the wider family,

"Oh So-and-So, he was a Returned Man," or, "he went with the First Echelon."

What these labels meant; I had no idea. Later I learnt of my mother's great frustration at being sent to the Waipiata sanitorium as a patient because the chest X-ray for her Army Nursing Service medical showed a possible shadow on her lung.

As I grew up the interest grew, and I came to understand that the entire world order of my youth resulted from this terrible conflict. People had little choice about the roles they played. And, like the Great War before it, they came home, said little, and got on with building the country.

I fear the next generation knows little about it; what it might have been like for those in it, and for those who stayed at home. Hence, my book The Rabbit Hunter is a story drawn from my experience of New Zealanders who lived through the war during the 1940s. The book follows the fortunes of a platoon

as they arrive in Athens and deploy to northern Greece. The first action that the New Zealand Division fought as a complete unit, they were part of a British force sent to bolster the defences of Greece against invasion threatened by Hitler's army. The initial clash soon led to a dash south to the evacuation beaches. While the characters are fictional, the events they experience are heavily based on fact.

The book finishes with the evacuation. The evacuees have little idea where they are going next. Readers will have to wait for the sequel to find out; watch this space!

Books are available from good bookshops, or from the author.
